CUS 215 GENDER, SEXUALITY AND CULTURAL POLITICS

This course provides students with an introduction to the histories and theories of feminist and LBGTQ (lesbian, bisexual, gay, transgender and queer) cultural politics. After examining briefly the cultural and socio-historical constuction of gender and sexuality according to Euro-American discourses, we will go on to address some of the specific issues feminist and LBGTQ movements are confronted with in various cultural contexts, namely in the US, Hong Kong and Taiwan. This course seeks to expand students' understanding of the intersections between gender, politics and sexuality through an investigation of global and local lesbian and gay social movements and the more recent "queer" and "tongzhi" politics which calls for a reexamination of identity categories and a more inclusive subjecthood.

Course Requirements

This course encourages close textual study of reading materials and applying your readings to reflection on your lived experiences. One presentation plus one paper related to the topics covered are expected from each student.

Students are expected to read 2-3 articles per week. All of the books from which the readings come from are either provided at least a week in advance or in the University library. Please finish all readings before class.

Students are expected to be open-minded in receiving new and/or sometimes controversial ideas. While students are encouraged to think and speak your minds freely and honestly, mindless and careless dismissal of reading materials is not supported. Students are expected to constantly challenge your own preconceptions and/or biases and are ready to be challenged.

All classes are conducted in the form of seminars supplemented occasionally by video screenings. Please be active and verbal within classroom.
